Guidance paper E Local RE: Guidance on visiting places of worship in the area.

This is a locally Agreed Syllabus for RE. Members of many faith communities have been involved in its development and it provides for a study of both Christianity, which has a special place in Nottingham City and County's religious history and contemporary life, and the other principal religions in the UK.

Jewish people, Muslims, Sikhs, Hindus and Buddhists have lived in Nottingham City and County, often for many decades. There are regional centres for each of these faiths within a few miles of all of our schools.

The children and young people of the city and county are growing up to live with religious plurality, locally, regionally, nationally and globally. RE can help them to prepare for adult life in a plural world by enabling learning from the local religious communities and develop the attitudes which promote community cohesion.

Schools are encouraged, wherever possible, to use authentic resources, including visits, visitors, artefacts, visual resources such as posters, video, ICT resources and photographs to bring the local communities of faith to life for pupils. While the local church, or a place of worship in Nottingham City or County may be a suitable starting point, the region is also rich in religious plurality, and the study of communities of faith in Derby, Leicester, Sheffield or other localities can be a powerful way of opening pupils' minds to the interest of a range of religions.

It is the intention of the ASC that a list of contacts, and other RE Syllabus materials, will be available digitally to schools on the RS Resources website. This will enable continual updating of the materials.

Visiting Places of Worship

Pupils benefit enormously from visits to places of worship, as it gives them first hand experiences and they often get the opportunity to meet with members of the faith community during the visit. Visits to places of worship can also lead to inviting members of faith communities to visit the classroom.

Visits do involve some preparation beforehand, and it is important to brief the host so any talks pupils listen to are at an appropriate level, and do not extend past pupils' concentration spans. Before pupils make the visit, prepare any work you want them to do, and brief them so they know what they will be doing. Consider what you want the visit to achieve, and what you want the pupils to actually do during the visit. Parents and helpers will also need to be informed. Following the School's visits and trips procedures will mean that these issues are covered effectively.

Ensure everyone involved in the visit is aware of any dress codes and what is appropriate behaviour, and what to expect during the visit, and why. In any place of worship, respectful behaviour and modest dress would be reasonable.

The following gives some general guidelines to prepare teachers regarding what to expect. They are general, and it is advisable to check with the place of worship in advance regarding specific rules in order not to give offence. It is also advisable to confirm a couple of days before the visit to ensure you are expected.

When visiting a place of worship with a school party, pupils are never participants in worship. Activities such as joining in prayers, offerings or songs to God are appropriate for believers, members of the faith community. But as educational visitors, the emphasis for pupils will always be on learning: appropriate activities include asking questions, listening to a short talk, observing worship, studying the artifacts of faith in the building, listening to an example of prayer or a reading from scripture and discussing how this would contribute to worship. The visit is not to the building as a museum, but to the building as a place of worship. Teachers will find many learning opportunities through such activities. School visits will always need to take account of the relevant health and safety guidance.

The opportunity to visit a place of worship places some burdens upon faith communities, which are usually met by voluntary effort. It may be appropriate for schools to make a financial contribution or donation, for example where photocopying costs have been incurred, or refreshments have been provided.

Some general guidance

Please check these ideas with your host when planning a visit.

Buddhist: Vihara, Temple.

You may be asked to remove your shoes before entering.

You will probably not be required to cover your head.

Christian: Cathedral, Church, Chapel, Hall, Citadel.

Although it is interesting to visit a variety of Christian traditions, schools often like to start with the local Church as there may already be a link with the minister and it may not be far for Key Stage 1 pupils to walk.

Find out where it is not appropriate for pupils to wander, such as behind the altar rail.

Hats should not be worn.

Hindu: Mandir, Temple

You may be asked to wash your hands before entering the Mandir.

It is usual to remove shoes.

Females might be asked to cover their heads - it is best to check local custom.

Do not enter shrine areas.

Do not point feet or fingers at shrines.

Visitors may be offered prashad / parshad (a sweet paste) or sweets, sometimes on arrival, sometimes on exit. (This can be accepted, or politely declined on the grounds of conscience – it is good to talk to pupils about this in advance).

Visitors may also be offered arti (a flame to pass your hands over). It is a symbol of the divine blessing. This can also be politely declined if it is not appropriate.

Jewish: Synagogue.

Males are normally provided with a kippah (skull cap) to wear. Occasionally females are asked to cover their heads, but not often.

In reform Synagogues males and females will not be separated, but some Orthodox synagogues separate the sexes, normally only when a service is taking place.

Muslim (Islam): Mosque.

Visitors may be asked to wash their hands (and possibly feet).

Females should have their heads covered with a headscarf (not a hat), and cover their arms and legs, and be discreetly dressed. Sometimes males and females are kept separate.

Sikh: Gurdwara.

Visitors may be asked to wash hands.

Shoes must be removed and legs must be covered.

Females wear a headscarf and males often wear a handkerchief to cover the head.

Adults are requested not to bring tobacco or alcohol into the Gurdwara.

When sitting on the floor, do not point your feet towards the Guru Granth Sahib (Sikh scriptures), as this is regarded as disrespectful.

Karah parshad, a sweet paste, may be offered. This can be accepted, or politely declined on the grounds of conscience.

A drink, and sometimes food, is usually offered in the langar (community kitchen) before leaving which it is generally polite to accept - you could arrange for this to be orange squash for pupils when planning the visit beforehand.
