1. Welcome

Cllr Boyd Elliott welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced Naomi from the National Justice Museum

2. Naomi gave a very interesting presentation on the training on offer to all Key stages, describing the various workshops including the courtroom workshop, the museum workshop and the city of caves workshops. She would welcome suggestions of areas which could be developed to include more Religious Education and spirituality

3. Apologies and membership

Ken explained how he had pursued the Society of Friends, the Sikh community, the Buddhist community and secondary teachers to fill the vacancies arising from the recent resignations but still waiting for replies. ATL and NUT have now merged so will be running with a vacancy as to change the designation we would have to change the constitution **Agreed to continue with a vacancy, Ken to continue to contact groups for replacements**

4. Minutes of the previous meeting were agreed after a minor adjustment requested on page 3 (gad not had). Cllr Elliott's first meeting so unaware of details of previous meeting

5. Action points from the minutes updatea) Holocaust event 2018

Ken explained that Andy Fox had agreed on behalf of NCC to fund the Holocaust event for the third year running, again very good response and oversubscribed, the 10 successful schools have been notified they are successful, the rest will be informed shortly

6. Matters arising not on the agenda

Ken reported the Mayflower celebrations are moving on for 2020

7. SACRE Effectiveness Plan

Ken described this is a note of what SACRE groups should be doing - a 5 year plan, an agreed syllabus in place to be reviewed at least every 5 years, an annual report sent to NASACRE etc. Graham Jennings mentioned about the cost/income of the last syllabus. Andy Fox explained we broke even as we sold the syllabus to Nottingham City Council.

8. Draft annual report

Ken said the annual report goes on the NASACRE website and to the DfE. It was emphasised the document produced is a draft only version, it hasn't been proof read. John Heard felt the chair summary was not coherent, doesn't read well, suggestions made i.e., the 3rd paragraph should be 1st paragraph, paragraph 4 moved to the end? Discussion over the summary, changes agreed.

It was pointed out that SACRE has created a Facebook page in line with NCC regulations. Richard noted Facebook is a good forum for sharing ideas/resources, Ken said not always easy to get teachers to share though. Cllr Elliott agreed good communication source. Asked about twitter, general feeling ok with just Facebook.

Regarding the GCSE grid results, there was a question over why gender separation on results, discussion over boys not achieving as well as girls, trying to close the gender gap or gender imbalance. This information might suggest ways of making the subject more popular with one gender and made us aware of any gender imbalances.

Short course results not available – Andy was to see if he could get any more information on them

Gemma Pettifor asked if we can have consistency in years, one is descending, one ascending. Graham Jennings asked for an asterix or nb at the foot of the grids to explain the blanks.

Paragraph 9 - to insert 'materials offering advice on diversity'

Paragraph 11 – areas for further improvement. Gemma Pettifor asked if we can make this more specific, discussion around the points, John Heard happy with the vague. Target 4 to be reworded. Cllr Elliott happy to raise the profile of SACRE with the chief executive of the local councils, and local communities including secondary academies.

Item 12 listing SACRE members, request for consistency, i.e. Fiona Hunter at Trent University not having brackets when the others have.

9. Developments locally/nationally on RE

- a) Withdrawal was noted as an area of concern Article in the Times regarding the withdrawal of pupils from RE in Staffordshire schools due to fear of attacks when visiting Mosques. Ken referred to the law and union guidance on the with reference to Headteacher action on this. Richard Linford said 1/5 of his school didn't want to go on a multi faith trip due to recent reports of mosque attacks. Ken would speak to someone from Staffordshire at the meeting next week.
- b) Agreed to pay the increased Subscription to NASACRE
- c) The Safeguarding & visits to Places of worship was noted. Richard Linford volunteered to work on this with support from several other colleagues to design some guidance on Risk Assessments & safeguarding measures.
- d) Interim Report on RE, Ken gave an overview of the report, encouraging that our SACRE meetings have always been quorate.
- e) Sections of the Report to gauge SACRE's feeling for answers. There was divergence of opinion on some of the statements. Ken to complete the Survey on behalf of SACRE
